**Under the patronage / The National Health Insurance Company (Daman), the Emirates Insurance Association organized a virtual conference on "Health Insurance in the Post-Covid-19 World" on Wednesday, November 25, with the participation of a group of insurance experts.**

**Conference recommendations**

- The necessity to start the procedures for the digital transformation process for companies because of its impact on raising the performance of companies and saving on the general administrative expenses of these companies.
- The need for all companies to take the necessary precautions to confront any pandemic that may occur in the future and to prepare to work from home in the event of a pandemic in the future, or anything that prevents employees from reaching their institutions.
- The need for the private sector to assume its responsibilities towards any future risks that may affect the health sector in the country and to provide support to government agencies to reduce the burdens on them.
- Cooperating with medical service providers in the country to avoid exaggeration in the medical procedures required for patients, especially in light of the current circumstances.
- To continue to hold this conference on an annual basis because of its benefit to the health insurance sector in the country.

- The necessity for insurance and reinsurance companies to study the possibility of including an additional condition for documents and reinsurance agreements regarding the risk of viruses, communicable and infectious diseases.
  
- Recommending the establishment of electronic platforms for the insurance sector to communicate between policyholders and beneficiaries from the insurance sector in the state.
  
- The need to work to raise citizens' awareness of how to prevent various diseases and the benefit of early detection as a form of risk management or an attempt to mitigate the risk.
